Friday Evening Program: History of Pisgah and Cherokee National

Forests - Marci Spencer

Marci is a retired nurse practitioner and medical missionary with a graduate degree from East Tennessee State University. She is the author of Clingmans Dome, Highest Mountain in the Great Smokies; Pisgah National Forest: a

History; Nantahala National Forest: a History; Pisgah Inn; and the upcoming, Cherokee National Forest: a History, all published by The History Press/Arcadia. Grateful Steps published her children's book, *Potluck*, Message Delivered: "The Great Smoky Mountains are Saved!" The Personal Story Publishing Project has published two of her essays, and Yosemite Conservancy published her essay in their book, The Wonder of It All: 100 Stories from the National Park Service.

Program Description: The U.S. has 154 national forests. In the Southern Appalachians, two national forests meet at the Tennessee/North Carolina border. Marci will share their USFS history of land acquisitions, wildlife protection, and resource management and their human history of the Cherokee people, settlers, and explorers

Saturday Evening Program:

Magic in the Dark: Nature's Magic Makers: Fireflies and Glowworms - Sharon Mammoser

As a child, Sharon Mammoser spent her free time outside exploring the wild land around her house in western New York. She got her first camera at age 10, fascinated with the natural world and wanting to share it with others.

Sharon earned a B. S. Degree in Education from SUNY New Paltz, and then went on to share natural history with people of all ages in several states. After completing a thru-hike of the 2000+ mile Appalachian Trail, she moved to western NC.

Program Description: Many of us have fond memories of running through a meadow on a moonless summer night, trying to catch the tiny insects blinking in the darkness. We laughed as we zigged and zagged, awed when we caught one, watching in wonder as the silent glow lit up our small hands. For me and many others, fireflies still evoke feelings of wonder.

Even though there are 2000 species of fireflies, most people know little about them. Do they all glow? What's their lifespan? Are they less common now? In this presentation we'll explore the lifecycle of fireflies and their unique adaptations. We'll also learn how to make our yards more firefly friendly.
