Speaker bio: With over twenty years of experience in the Tennessee State Parks system, Monica Johnson brings extensive leadership and field expertise to her role as Park Manager at Roan Mountain State Park. She has demonstrated a strong ability to engage volunteers and visitors alike, connecting them to the park's natural and cultural resources. Monica oversees diverse park operations, including campground, camp store, cabins, visitor center museum, gift shop, day-use facilities, and a variety of seasonal and full-time staff. She holds a Master of Science degree in Parks and Recreation Management from Middle Tennessee State University. Monica is also the author of *Benny the Hellbender: Don't Dam the Doe*, a children's book promoting river conservation and environmental education. Outside of work, Monica enjoys hiking, photography, rock climbing, and inspiring the next generation to explore and protect Tennessee's natural treasures.

- ◆ **Dr. Blaine Schubert** "The Gray Fossil Site, Appalachian Bears, and Beyond"




Speaker bio: Dr. Blaine Schubert is a vertebrate paleontologist at East Tennessee State University. There he serves as the Executive Director of the Center of Excellence in Paleontology, which oversees the Gray Fossil Site & Museum. He is also Professor in the Department of Geosciences where he teaches courses in

paleontology. Dr. Schubert's research focuses on late Cenozoic amphibians, reptiles, and mammals. Primary areas of concentration include the paleobiology of prehistoric bears, Pleistocene extinctions, and cave paleontology.

Speaker Bio: Kelly Celeste Porter has been a member of the faculty at East Tennessee State University since 2014, where she teaches graphic design and visual communication. She holds an M.F.A. in Graphic Design from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and a B.F.A. in Graphic Communication from the University of Southern Mississippi. Prior to academia, Kelly worked as a designer and design researcher with Ryobi Power Tools and for cultural and tourism organizations including the B.B. King Museum, Mississippi Delta Tourism, and the Mississippi Blues Trail. Her teaching and creative practice emphasize cross-disciplinary, real-world, and service-learning experiences, often developed in collaboration with campus partners and the surrounding community. Kelly's work in branding, identity, sustainable design, and photography has received local, regional, national, and recognition. In 2024, she earned her Southern Appalachian Naturalist Certification from the Great Smoky Mountains Institute at Tremont. Her current work focuses on the intersections of environmental education, sustainability, and visual communication.
